Note from Pastor...

KINDNESS

Have you heard this old Glen Campbell song from back in the 70's called "Try a Little Kindness"? The chorus goes like this:

You got to try a little kindness
Yes show a little kindness
Just shine your light for everyone to see
And if you try a little kindness
Then you'll overlook the blindness
Of narrow-minded people on the narrow-minded streets.

This sounds like good advice for the church today, especially because this is what we are called to do. Jesus lived a life of kindness as an example for us. It's what we are to do.

We read many stories of Jesus' ministry and we can quickly identify the miracles and parables as God's intervening in a life, restoring a person to wholeness, and even teaching a lesson that needs to be learned but I often wonder if we ever catch the message behind all that Jesus did. Do we ever come to understand the kindness and compassion that was behind the scenes, the driving force of God's love demonstrated as kindness and compassion. Repeatedly we find Jesus getting down in the dirt with those in pain or in need of help, those who needed a kind word. They came from all walks of life, all echelons of society, rich and poor, educated and uneducated, slave and free. Jesus cared for each of them. No where in scripture do I find Jesus telling someone, "You got yourself into this mess, get yourself out." No where does Jesus say, "You've made the same mistake repeatedly, I'm not helping this time."

No Jesus raised the dead out of kindness and compassion for the parents who lost a child. He cleansed the leper out of compassion for his suffering. He dined with sinners to let them know God's love. Jesus took pity on lepers and healed them of their disease. He sees people who need his help. Do we?

He accepted disciples from all walks of life. He reached out to those no one wanted to bother with, even outsiders and Gentiles. He healed the woman with the issue of blood, even calling her "daughter" to let her know she belonged to God and was restored to the household of faith. He forgave those who hurt him who sinned against him. Most important of all, he gave up his life so all of us could be saved. Do we give a moment to help? To speak kindness to others? Through all this Jesus taught kindness and compassion goes beyond stereotypes. We need to look at where they are coming from and understand their circumstances. Only then can we truly develop genuine compassion for others.

There are still those who would rather keep score of the failures of others than to explore where their own compassion is lacking. They keep track of every error and will remind you of every time you are not perfect. May God have compassion on us all.

In the words of Mother Teresa, "If you judge people, you have no time to love them."
