Unity takes Work

A young couple came to the minister's office to ask if he would marry them. They knew that the minister and his wife had been married for over thirty years and seemed genuinely happy together. In fact, you never saw one of them without the other. They wanted that kind of happiness in their own marriage.

The minister sat the couple down and asked all the usual questions about faith and their expectations of each other and their concept of living together as husband and wife. After receiving what they thought were satisfactory answers the minister asked them one last question. "How will you solve disputes in your handling of problems, such as how to handle budgets or where to live?" The old minister noticed that they were not in agreement on how to handle the conflicts in their marriage that would surely come. The man thought he should have the final say because he was more logical and the woman thought she would be closer to right in most situations because she would feel the deepest about the results.

Church, know that God is our partner in all we are called to do. Let's agree to walk together.



Good Evening

I wanted to take a moment to share a story about our Scouting program and one of our remarkable youth members.

Samuel Parrott is a First Class Scout who joined our Troop two years ago. For those unfamiliar with Scout Ranks, earning First Class means Samuel has demonstrated strong proficiency in outdoor skills, citizenship, first aid, and physical fitness—foundational elements of Scouting.

Many members of KPC have seen our Scouts at events like Scout Sunday, church cleanup days, the Youth

Luncheon, Cemetery cleanup, and my children's personal favorite, the bake sale . While most people know we camp and do outdoor activities, they might not always see the full scope of what Scouting teaches. I'd like to share a recent experience that truly illustrates the impact of our program.

Just yesterday, while vacationing on the northern tip of Kauai, Samuel and his family were snorkeling when tsunami alerts began sounding. They had little time to react. Quickly and calmly, they packed up and began evacuating, searching for higher ground.

They found a park at a higher elevation and pulled over to shelter. There, Samuel and his family planned how to conserve the limited food and water they had with them, and where to take cover, either outside or in their vehicle, depending on how conditions developed. They knew they would be camping there overnight.

As more families arrived at the park, Samuel and his siblings sprang into action. They cleaned up debris around the area, made the space safer, and began helping other evacuees. They handed out juice boxes to frightened children and helped lift everyone's spirits by organizing games. In a potentially frightening and uncertain situation, Samuel's calm leadership and compassion shone through.

Thankfully, disaster was avoided. But Samuel's response, his leadership, preparedness, community service, and resilience are all qualities fostered through his Scouting journey. Even Samuel's siblings were impressed; at one point, one of them turned to him and said, "Samuel, you definitely deserve a merit badge for this one."

Samuel's mother Leanne, who also serves as one of our leaders, texted me afterward to say, "Scouting pays off." And she's right. The program here at KPC is helping shape young people like Samuel into capable, caring leaders, and we couldn't do it without your support.

Thank you for all you do for our youth and for believing in the mission of Scouting.
